History



NATO Summit 2014

The NATO-Georgia Joint Training and Evaluation Centre (JTEC) is one of Defense Capacity Building initiatives under the umbrella of the Substantial NATO-Georgia Package (SNGP), endorsed at the NATO Summit in Wales in August 2014. The Package includes defense capacity building, training, exercises, strengthen liaison, and enhanced interoperability opportunities.



JTEC inauguration 2015

In May 2015 was established the JTEC project team and in August 2015 it was inaugurated at its headquarters in Krtsanisi by NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg and prime minister of Georgia His Excellence Irakli Garinashvili.



Establishment 2016

As an organization the JTEC was established in May 2016.

Foundation OCT 2017

Since 2017 up to date, OCT course under the Training Evaluation Center (TEC) has been successfully functioning in JTEC. During this period, 286 OCTs have been trained for the Georgian Defense Forces. Since 2019 JTEC started IOCT course, JTEC has already conducted 2 courses, 28 students has successfully graduated from IOCT course.



History



JFTC/JTEC From Mentorship to Partnership 2020

NATO-Georgia Joint Training and Evaluation Centre (JTEC) and NATO Joint Force Training Centre (JFTC) signed a partnership agreement. Brigadier General Irakli Chichinadze, Deputy Chief of GDF, and Major General Adam Joks, JFTC Commander, signed the document of Partnership Agreement consists of various aspects of cooperation.



Mission



Training Evaluation Center (TEC)

To train and evaluate GDF tactical units towards a pre-defined mission essential task list and training objectives on squad, platoon and company levels. The center also trains observer coach trainers for GDF & NATO member and Partner countries.



IOCT Course Capabilities



Course Description

The International Observer Coach Trainer (IOCT) Course fully supports NATO interoperability by increasing the number and quality of OCTs for training exercises up to multinational level. It is a five-day residential course at the Joint Training Evaluation Centre (JTEC) near Tbilisi, Georgia.



Aim

To increase the number and quality of trained OCTs from selected military personnel and leaders who can coach and assess military units according to NATO standards.

Upon graduation students will be able to observe, assess, and provide feedback to Training units within their career field and military unit echelon.



Course Objectives

- Perform the OCT's duties and responsibilities.
- Explain OE/EXPRO OE (Operational Environment).
- Facilitate an AAR.
- Apply MEDEVAC procedures in real life emergency.
- Employ the MILES.





Student Criteria

The IOCT Course is designed to prepare future OCTs to observe, coach-train assess, and provide feedback within their functional area of expertise regarding a unit's performance during a training exercise. Course participants will gain the knowledge and skills for controlling and assessing military units during training exercises. The course is open to NATO, PfP, MD, ICI and PatG countries.

Location

Training will be conducted at the Joint Training and Evaluation Centre (JTEC) and, „NORIO” training area.

Course Requirements

a. Position:

Military Officers and NCOs selected to temporarily support exercises as an OCT;
Military Officers and NCOs selected to permanently serve in OCT positions.

b. Rank Requirement:

NCOs: OR-4 to OR-8;
Officers: OF-1 to OF-4.

c. Language Proficiency:

English language proficiency levels and requirements for IOCT Course participants are in accordance with NATO STANAG 6001 (2014): 2/2/1+/1+. The English language certificate should be provided (via e-mail) with the application form.

Number of Students and Course Duration
It is a five-day residential course

Minimum -8 military personnel; Maximum - 16 military personnel;

Quota per nation: 2 (two) per nation.

Places will be allocated in order of applications received.

Course Fees, Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation, meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner (MRE will be provided during field exercise)) will be provided on the JTEC base and will be covered by MOD of Georgia.

MOD of Georgia fully covers course fee.

Student has opportunity to choose leave outside the base (in Tbilisi city), however all cost has to be covered by student.

Transportation

Travel costs to and from Georgia are to be covered by the sending nation.

MOD of Georgia will provide local transportation from and to Tbilisi International Airport.

If student will choose to leave outside the base (in Tbilisi city) MOD of Georgia will provide transportation between hotel and JTEC base.

Communication

The internet access and Wi-Fi will be provided.



Visa

Visa expenses are covered by the sending nation. Visa free entrance for citizens of the EU, NATO and the majority of PfP countries.

Dress Code/ Equipment

Civilian uniform (casual), combat uniform, waterproof jacket, webbing set/assault west, cold weather gloves.

Medical Service

Initial level of medical support will be provided by the locally assigned doctor. Dental care and medical treatment exceeding first aid is to be paid for. It is strongly advised to have an international medical insurance valid for the entire stay in Georgia.

Evaluation System

Participants will be evaluated according to the Centre's evaluation system based on the practical exercise and written tests. Successful participants will receive course certificates.

Social Programme

Participants will be offered to participate in the cultural event hosted by the MoD of Georgia.

Training Strategy

The course is 40 hours conducted over five days and includes: 12 hours of lectures; 12 hours of demonstration & performance; 10 hours of role play; 1-hour theoretical individual test; and 5 hours of administrative time. Prior to the course participants should review basic infantry doctrine. During the course Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) will deliver theory lessons, facilitate discussions, and provide demonstrations. Practical exercises will be conducted for specific POs with live troops acting as BLUFOR and OPFOR to enable the students to deliver After Action Reviews (AAR). Summative assessments will include: a 20-question individual written test worth 20% of the final course grade and two AAR individual practical assessments each worth 40% of the final course grade. In order to graduate students will need to score 70% or higher on the final course grade. Students can access an online educational platform containing all course material and references throughout the course to enhance and support learning.
